

## Data subject rights according to the GDPR

Here you can find an overview of the data protection rights of your club members towards you as the responsible party according to GDPR  
(General Data Protection Regulation)

### Definition of "responsible person" Art. 4 par. 7 GDPR

The natural or legal person, public authority, agency or other body which alone or jointly with others determines the purposes and means of the processing of personal data.

### Definition of "personal data" Art. 4 par. 1 GDPR:

Any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person (hereinafter "data subject"); an identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person;

<b>Art. 7 par. 3</b>	<b>Withdrawal of consent</b>	The data subject has the right to withdraw his or her consent at any time. The revocation of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of the processing carried out on the basis of the consent until the revocation.
<b>Art. 12</b>	<b>Transparent information</b>	The controller shall take appropriate measures to provide the data subject with all the information referred to in Articles 13 and 14 and all the notifications referred to in Articles 15 to 22 and Article 34 relating to the processing in a precise, transparent, intelligible and easily accessible form in plain and simple language; this shall apply in particular to information specifically addressed to children. The information shall be provided in writing or in another form, including, where appropriate, electronically. If requested by the data subject, the information may be provided orally, provided that the identity of the data subject has been proven in another form.

<b>Art. 13</b>	<b>Obligation to inform</b>	If personal data are collected from the data subject, the controller shall inform the data subject at the time of collection of such data. The scope of the information is derived from Art. 13 of the Regulation.
<b>Art. 15</b>	<b>Right of information</b>	The data subject has the right to request confirmation as to whether personal data is being processed; if this is the case, the data subject has the right to obtain information about this personal data and the information listed in detail in Art. 15 GDPR.
<b>Art. 16</b>	<b>Right to rectification</b>	The data subject has the right to request without undue delay the rectification of inaccurate personal data and the completion of incomplete personal data.
<b>Art. 17</b>	<b>Right to deletion</b>	The data subject has the right to request that personal data concerning him or her be deleted without delay if one of the reasons listed in Art. 17 GDPR applies, e.g. if the data is no longer required for the purposes pursued. However, the grounds for exclusion in Art. 17 par. 3 GDPR must be observed here.
<b>Art. 18</b>	<b>Restriction of processing</b>	The data subject has the right to request the restriction of processing if one of the conditions set out in Art. 18 GDPR is met.
<b>Art. 19</b>	<b>Obligation to notify</b>	The controller shall notify all recipients to whom personal data have been disclosed of any rectification or erasure of the personal data or restriction of processing pursuant to Article 16, Article 17 par. 1 and Article 18, unless this proves impossible or involves a disproportionate effort. The controller shall inform the data subject of these recipients if the data subject so requests.
<b>Art. 20</b>	<b>Data portability</b>	The data subject shall have the right to receive the personal data concerning him or her that he or she has provided to a controller in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format, and shall have the right to transmit such data to another controller without hindrance from the controller to whom the personal data were provided.

<b>Art. 77</b>	<b>Right to complain</b>	Without prejudice to any other administrative or judicial remedy, every data subject shall have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority, in particular in the Member State of his or her habitual residence, place of work or the place of the alleged infringement, if the data subject considers that the processing of personal data relating to him or her infringes this Regulation.
